Description

Victorian hand-forged double-struck silver cutlery set for 12 settings in the King's Husk pattern and featuring the classic husk heel on the back of the spoons and forks. All pieces are in excellent condition with crisp detail and good long prongs to the forks.

This set was made by William Eaton, noted for his fine silver cutlery silversmithing skills, with the exception of the teaspoons which were made by William's daughter Elizabeth.

A lesser known variant of the Kings pattern, based around the hourglass form, King's Husk was first produced during the Regency period. The elegant shape allied to the detailed and fine husk separate it from the more frequently and sometimes mass-produced King's and Queen's patterns.

The set comprises:

- 12 table forks
- 12 dessert forks
- 12 tablespoons (Charles Eaton)
- 12 dessert spoons
- 6 teaspoons (Elizabeth Eaton)

Since antique knives rarely survive, this cutlery set is completed with 12 matching modern pairs of Kings Husk silver table and dessert knives with stainless steel blades, making them suitable for the dishwasher.
