Description

This charming example of a late 18th century silver cream or milk jug is absolutely typical of the period. Its graceful helmet-shaped form, bead pattern borders, reeded handle and delicate engraving personify the era. There is an oval shield beneath the lip the the original entwined initials of the original owner - JHB.

A highly skilled craftswoman, Hester Bateman was renowned for her high quality flatware and ornamental silverware, and was the most famous 18th century English female silversmith. She was part of the prominent Bateman family of silversmiths that included her sons, daughter-in-law, grandson and great-grandson.
