Description

Massive and exceptional early Victorian gilded silver jug presented for the Queen's Plate at the 1839 Richmond Races. It was won by Beeswing (1833-1854), a British thoroughbred hailed as the greatest mare in Britain and one of the greatest of all time.

This majestic piece is richly adorned with finely hand-chased decoration of textured leaves, lion masks and dolphin heads among scrolling cartouches and textured backgrounds. On each side are cast and applied horse models in high relief.

This is a particularly heavy piece with superb quality decoration. Classical masks feature around the knopped stem and a beautifully modelled mask of Bacchus is cast and applied below the spout.
