Description

Made during the Edwardian era, a pair of tall antique silver Corinthian column candelabra, each with twobranches and three lights. Demonstrating their versatility, the detachable branches can be put together on one candlestick to make a single five-light candelabrum. For a more simple setting, both sets of branches can be removed to leave an elegant pair of candlesticks, featuring all the classical motifs reflected in the neoclassical style.

The height of this pair of silver candelabra means they are perfect for throwing more light across the table and the wax drips or nozzles are all detachable, making them easier to clean.

Neoclassicism is the 18th and 19th century movement that developed in Europe as a reaction to the excesses of Baroque and Rococo styles that were dominant in the previous era. The movement sought to return to the classical beauty and magnificence of the Ancient Greece and the Roman Empire.
